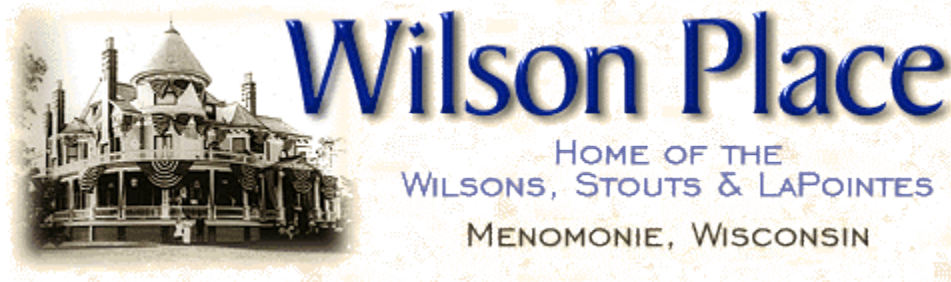

WILSON PLACE MANSION TOUR

Built in 1859 by Capt. William Wilson a partner in the Knapp- Stout Lumber Company in Menomonie Wisconsin, Wilson Place is an icon of the lumbering era. After the death of William and his wife the home was owned by his son-in-law James H. Stout the father of UW-Stout. Following the Stout's, the mansion was owned by Wilson's grandson George La Pointe who was also a lumberman in the early 1900's.

During the 1870's and 1880's the Knapp-Stout Lumber Company was arguably the largest single lumber company in the world, Capt. Wilson was an active partner in that firm. So come to Menomonie to learn about the company and to tour Capt. Wilsons home.
