Forest Products Laboratory: Building A Durable Baseball Bat

Back in 1910, Wisconsin, home to the legendary lumberman Paul Bunyan, was at the epicenter of America's insatiable appetite for lumber. Much of Wisconsin's northern forests had been cleared, and the U.S. Government established the Forest Products Laboratory at the University of Wisconsin Madison to come up ways of using the suddenly scarce resource more efficiently. To this day, the FPL is the only federally funded wood products research center. Given that big-league ballplayers go through approximately 16,500 wooden baseball bats each season, it's not surprising that Major League Baseball is one of the Forest Product Lab's biggest clients. Wasp Releases to Fight Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)

This summer, DNR staff will continue to do introductions of three natural enemy wasps that attack emerald ash borer: Tetrastichus planipennisi, Spathius galinae and Oobius agrili. The Tetrastichus and Spathius wasps attack EAB larvae beneath the bark, and the Oobius wasps attack EAB eggs on the bark surface. The tiny wasps do not sting or bite, and the public is unlikely to know they are present. *Read More*

Watch for Giant Hogweed in Your Wetland

The tall invasive plant giant hogweed was first found in Wisconsin in 2004 and has been confirmed in Iron, Portage, and Manitowoc Counties. It was recently found in Sheboygan. A single plant produces thousands of seeds, which can be dispersed by gravity, vehicles and gear, flowing water, or animals. Giant hogweed prefers moist shady areas. *Read More*

The historic giant sequoia in Boise, Idaho, towers some 10 stories tall. At more than a century old, it also weighs a hefty 800,000 pounds and measures roughly 20 feet around at its base. Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as *Watch Video*, *Read More*, or *For More Information*.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
